# Green Flag Award 3rd Year Running

Oakfield Park Blaby scooped the Green Flag Community Flag award for the 3rd year. This award officially recognises the hard work and dedication to make it one of the country's best Community parks, Blaby Parish Council is one of only 5 Parish Councils in the country to receive the award.

# **PRECEPT 2025/26**

During January 2024 the Parish Council met to decide on its precept for the coming financial year (2024/2025). The precept is the amount of money required by the Council to pay for the provision of facilities and services in the village. The agreed sum is added to the requirements of the District and County Councils along with those of the Fire Authority and Police and Crime Commissioner to make up the Council Tax for the year.

As well as the day to day provision of facilities and service, the Council looks at other areas of the village where expenditure can enhance the village or the facilities provided.

The precept for the coming financial year was set at £456,881 which equates to £207.71 a year for a Parish Council increase of 11.42% which represents a 11.43% increase on a Council Tax Band D property for the current year.

The Parish Council's agreed expenditure has been allocated between the running costs of the Council owned buildings and assets which include energy bills, insurance, office expenses and all other items required to maintain the day to day operations of the Council, these have increased due to the overall increase in utility bills.

Another area where the Council provides money is for the events which it runs, the budget for these has actually decreased since last year but the Council is still able to put on a fantastic Summer Fun Day and Christmas Lights Switch-on, any income received from these events is put back into the Council for future events.
